At the 2004 Spring Conference in Houston, STAC
(Surgical Training Administrators Certification Board)

was established to develop a certification process for managers of surgical training programs. Letters of support were received and read from ARCS and the APDS. STAC met in July to determine the guidelines and content areas for the process, after which small groups were formed to focus on each area. AMERICAN BOARD OF SURGERY UPDATE:

Two Important Changes to the 2005 Qualifying Examination in Surgery

2005 QE to be given in August



The ABS has made two significant changes to the Qualifying Examination in Surgery (QE) for 2005. The first is that the examination will be administered on Thursday, **August 11, 2005**, rather than in October. This change in time of year will give residents who are successful in the QE more options in choosing a time and location to take the Certifying Examination, facilitate their transition to fellowships or practice, and allow them more time to focus on their new activities.

With the QE being given two months earlier, the entire application process will be shifted accordingly. The regular deadline for receipt of the completed application form (without the penalty of

a late fee) will be in mid-May and the late deadline (including a late fee) will be in mid-June. These deadlines are needed for both application processing and to allow applicants the maximal time to register at an examination center near them (see below). The ABS recognizes that these new deadlines will not permit applicants to submit their full chief year operative experience, however, this has never been a requirement—the applicant's operative experience must only meet the ABS' defined minimums (500 procedures in five years, with 150 in the chief year and a balanced operative experience across all essential content areas).

A Computer-Based QE for 2005

The second significant change is that the 2005 Qualifying Examination in Surgery will be given as a computer-based examination through Pearson VUE™, the ABS' testing services vendor. The change to a computer-based format will afford residents greater flexibility in examination locations as they will be able to choose from over 200 testing centers nationwide operated by Pearson VUE. Since some centers may have limited space, residents should submit their applications as early as possible so that they will be able to schedule their examination at the center closest to them.

Further information on both of these changes will be sent to program directors and coordinators in the near future and will be discussed at the ARCS Annual Meeting in New York.

ARCS STEERING COMMITTEE

The ARCS Steering Committee consists of an eight-member board, each serving a maximum term of four years. A President-Elect will be elected by the Steering Committee at the Annual ARCS Fall Planning meeting to serve for a term of one year. A Secretary will also be elected to serve for one year and may not be elected for more than two consecutive terms. In addition, the committee will select new members as needed to maintain its membership of eight. These members

will be announced at the Spring ARCS meeting. Please consider submitting your name for consideration as a steering committee member at the spring meeting in New York.
