Message From The President

JEOPARDY!

Coordinator's Jeopardy will take on a new twist at the ARCS National Conference in Toronto during the week of April 14th to April 17th. Coordinator's Jeopardy is scheduled for Thursday, April 17, 2008 at 10:15am. We have decided to discontinue use of a buzzer system for Jeopardy this year. After much discussion, we felt that the following changes would help enhance the atmosphere of this session. The changes are as follows:

Two rounds – Regular Jeopardy and Double Jeopardy.

Six teams of five coordinators each: three teams will play Jeopardy and three teams will play Double Jeopardy.

Coordinators from Jeopardy and Double Jeopardy will join together for the final Jeopardy question.

The audience will be the 4th team and will answer any questions that are answered incorrectly.

Random drawing will dictate which team goes first.

If the team that goes first misses the question/answer, the opportunity to answer will move to the next team, and so on.

The team that answers the question correctly will continue to pick a topic until they answer incorrectly.

Once a team incorrectly answers a question, the team next in line will then pick a topic.

Points will be deducted for any missed questions as well as points added for correct answers.

Teams with a negative point balance at the end of Double Jeopardy will not move on to Final Jeopardy.

Rules and regulations for Jeopardy will be reviewed prior to the start of the session.

Points will be deducted from those teams who argue with any decision made by the panel of judges.

Jeopardy is a fun, interactive session and is a great way to test your knowledge, or refresh what you already know. We have received so many positive comments regarding this session we decided to bring it back. Many of your suggestions for improvement have also been incorporated into our new rules. Everyone is invited to join together with fellow coordinators and participate in another informative Jeopardy session this upcoming year.

I look forward to seeing you in Toronto and your active participation.

TAGME CERTIFICATION

Certification is being offered at the Spring 2008 Toronto meeting. It will be held on Monday, April 14, 2008 from 1 - 6 PM, location to be announced. Applications for certification can be downloaded from the TAGME website at www.tagme.org. Send your completed application to Linda Billingsley. Her contact information is on the website.

Because the ACGME and Surgery RRC have approved revised common program requirements, institutional requirements, and general surgery program requirements, both the monitored and work effort assessment tools have been revised. These revised tools will be in effect for the Spring 2008 assessment.

At the Fall 2007 TAGME Board meeting, it was decided that as of January 2008, certification will be for 5 years. Those who were certified prior to January 2008 still fall under the 3 year requirement. The recertification process includes the completion of the application, including meeting all criteria including time on the job; attendance at a GME focused national meeting; participation in an internal review and/or site visit; documentation of personal professional development; and successful completion of the re-certification assessment tool. Opportunities for personal professional development have expanded, please see the website for further explanation for this.

Mentorship Program

Beginning a new job can be very stressful, especially the role of surgical residency coordinator. Believe it or not - I can remember 20 years ago, my first day on the job; I heard M & M and I was thinking plain or peanut...

As we all know, the surgical residency coordinator position is very demanding and detail oriented. In most cases, there is only one surgical residency coordinator per institution, and in some instances, only one surgical residency coordinator in the state. To provide support and lend a hand to new coordinators (<3 years experience), ARCS has established a mentor network. This support system was orchestrated to help new coordinators understand the many ACGME, ABS, and RRC requirements, and also to let them know that they are not alone in this endeavor. The mentorship program pairs seasoned coordinators (>3 years experience) with new coordinators. The veteran and the inexperienced coordinator interact, exchange ideas, problem solve, determine answers to questions, make other acquaintances, and in many circumstances create friendships.

Up-to-date U.S. Passports will be required!

You might want to check with your institution to see if they are willing to reimburse you for your passport fee.

United States citizens can visit the State Department's web site <http://travel.state.gov>, or call the U.S. National Passport Information Center: (877) 4USA-PPT. Please allow 6 weeks for processing of the passport application. Peak domestic passport processing is between January and July.
